И во тестот и во листот за одговори пишувај исклучиво со пенкало. Одговорите на задачите напишани со молив се вреднуваат со нула (0) поени.

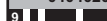

1 Blog is short for “web log”: a site (web) that creates a record (log) of what is happening. A blog is like a mixture of a diary and a guide. A blog is different from other sites in that information and news is added frequently and is printed in reverse chronological order (with the latest news at the top). Blogs contain links to other sites and leave space for readers to add their own ideas and opinions. The best blogs become online communities where people can meet and exchange information on any number of topics from art to sport and technology to relationships.

2 There are two main types of blogs: online diaries, which record the blogger’s ideas and opinions and information services, which give all the latest news on a specific subject. Blogs are written by individuals and the news goes straight onto the Internet. This means that all the information on a blog is uncensored and escapes government control.

3 “I love my blog! It’s my space in the world and I control it. I only give posting rights to people I like and agree with. If anyone posts something I disagree with I take it down and stop them from logging into my blog.” *Hiromi - Matsue (Japan)*

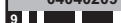

Using a rubber frog as bait, he managed to hook the monster. There was a *desperate* fight but Peter was determined to capture the pike and he succeeded. 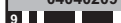

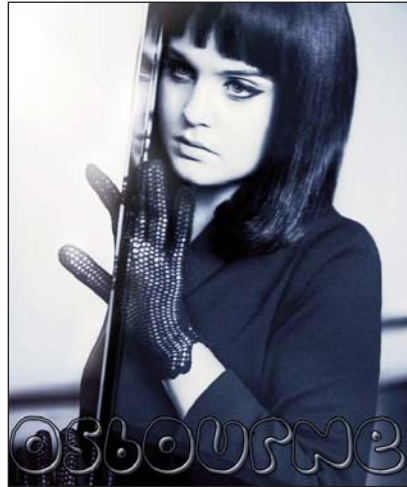

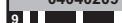
C. Luke
